SH College team tracks down rare spider

scholars from the Arachnology Division of the Department of Zoology, Sacred Heart College, Thevara, has identified a rare spider earlier spotted only in eastern Himalayas.

The spider Araneus Himalayaensis was identified after pioneering investigations on the spider fauna of the shola by scholars including A V Sudhikumar, Aby P Varghese and Sunil

> Jose under the guidance of Dr P A Sebastian who heads the division of arachnology, Sacred Heart College. The team had extensively surveyed the Marayur and Kanthalloor areas of Idukki district. So far the famous India arachnologist Dr B K Tikader has recorded existence of this species in eastern Himalayas in 1975. He described the specimen in his book titled 'Fauna of Indian Spiders'.

> The spider has yellowish brown legs with dark patches and shades. The abdomen is greyish white with black patches and the total body length is about 9 mm. It has an elongated triangular abdomen with a pair of shoulder humps. The ventral side of the abdomen is greyish brown. The team has identified as many as 38 spiders from the fragile Mannavan Shola.

> Environmentalists have recently demanded conservation of the shola forests including the controversial Mathikettan Shola because of their bio-diversity and ecological significance.
